This is a summary that I plan on completing weekly.

After Christmas Break, teachers came back for an inservice day. Teachers were given updates for the upcoming semester, as well as participated in a one-hour Predictive Index workshop presented by Brian Millis, a consultant with Advisa. Teachers learned about what their primary "drives" are, and how those drives can be utilized to work best with co-workers, students, and supervisors.

#### Guidance

The Prospective Student Open House saw a good turnout. We physically counted 167 visitors, but we suspect that the number was between 167 and 200. Prospective students and their families visited classrooms and teachers and asked questions of and conversed with administration.

Enrollment is in full swing at most of our sending schools. I have been in constant communication with our supporting counselors and prospective students answering questions and sharing my knowledge of our programs.
