Curriculum and Instruction

PLTW Certification: Central Nine was part of a PLTW Certification Visit on March 20. Representatives from the Biomedical Sciences program came for the morning to observe classes, as well as interact with teachers and community partners. We are pleased to announce that our PLTW Biomedical Sciences Program is now certified. A highlight from the visiting team was the, "Caring, qualified teachers who have earned the respect and cooperation of students." Students are now eligible for transcripted Credit through IUPUI.

Staffing:

- Our Advanced Culinary Instructor resigned March 10, 2014. We interviewed three good candidates over Spring Break. We hope to have the position filled within the next two weeks.
- Our Diesel Service Technology Instructor will resign as of April 18, 2014. We hope to interview candidates next week.

Curriculum: Based on industry feedback, we planning to have students enrolled in Advanced Manufacturing, Electronics, Precision Machining, and Welding earn an additional 1 credit in Industrial Repair and Maintenance. Students would be primarily enrolled in their program of choice, and would rotate 3 times at one-week intervals to the other instructors to learn the content outlined in the table below:

For example, a student enrolled in Precision Machine would still get their Precision Machine Credits (3), and would earn an additional 1 credit for Industrial Repair and Maintenance by spending 3 1-week time periods (each semester) with the other instructors. This student in Precision Machine Technology would come away with some basic experience in Welding, Electronics, Pneumatics and Problem Solving. Industrial Repair and Maintenance is already on our DOE Course Inventory, so it does not need to be added.
