## Principal

### Health Sciences Academy

### Curriculum and Instruction

**The 2011-12 Character Education Program** at Central Nine Career Center is underway. The program began in September with the Character trait "Honor" in recognition of the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of September 11<sup>th</sup>. **Honor** means, "Respecting others because of the higher authorities they represent".

The 2011-12 Curriculum Mapping school-wide initiative is off to a good start. The teachers had an opportunity to attend one workshop on how to map their program curriculum during the month of September. The teachers have been afforded another work session during the month of October in order to continue developing their curriculum map. The teachers have also been encouraged to use the current drafts of the IDOE Career Pathway curriculum frameworks as guides in developing their curriculum maps.

The Phase I & II Career Pathway Programs developed by Indiana Department of Education are currently available online and the state has requested teachers to pilot the curriculum frameworks. Central Nine has four programs that will serve as pilots this year. The **Literacy initiative** at Central Nine is underway with since students have now completed their Student Reading Inventory (SRI) Assessment. The data has been reviewed by our English teacher and students who score in the Basic and Below Basic reading levels will have the opportunity to participate in remediation activities specific to their program area. These students will engage in literacy building activities that are geared towards developing their reading comprehension and literacy skills.

### Murray & Associates/Career Day

On September 29 a representative from Murray & Associates met with students regarding the importance of financial aid and how they can benefit from participating in their program. All seniors were called to the Commons to view a PowerPoint designed specifically for them. The remaining 10th/11th grade students were called to the Commons according to their enrolled program. A follow up parent meeting was held from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. Approximately 65 people were in attendance. Last year students were awarded nearly \$500,000.00. During the day on October 6<sup>th</sup> students also had the opportunity to visit four different post-secondary institutions. The students completed a registration form on the internet to determine which presentation to attend based off of the organization's degrees offered in and the students' area of interest. Representatives from IVY Tech, Lincoln Tech, DeVry, Vincennes, Air Force, Navy, Marines, National Guard, Chef's Academy, Fortis, ITT Technical Institute, IUPUI, Ohio Technical College, Kaplan, The Art Institute, Indiana Business College, Wyo Tech, Johnson and Wales, & Harrison College were in attendance.

### ASVAB Interpretation

One of the key components to taking the ASVAB is the score interpretation session, as it explains in depth what the score actually means. The state program coordinator of ASVAB, Nathaniel Grandberry, conducted interpretation to all C9 during the month of September.

Perry Meridian Middle School students toured the facility on Tuesday, October 4. There were approximately 100 students for the 9:30 a.m. session and as well as 100 students for the 12:00 p.m. session.
