A. Teaching, Business, or Industrial Experience Credit to be granted upon initial employment:

The maximum Experience Level granted to teachers is Experience Level 10 on the Base Salary Schedule. All business or industrial experience must have been full-time experience, directly related to the program being taught and approved by the director. No credit will be allowed for part-time work experience. If a teacher's calculation for experience ends in "½ or .5" the Experience Level will be taken to the next lowest whole number.

- 1. Teachers with an active Occupational Specialist, Workplace Specialist, or traditional teaching license will be granted Experience Level credit on the Base Salary Schedule equal (1:1) to the number of years of verifiable public teaching experience.
- 2. Teachers with or without a teaching license will be granted Experience Level credit on the Base Salary Schedule on the following basis for their business or industrial work experience.
 - a. A teacher without a Bachelor's degree may be given credit for a Bachelor's degree on the basis of five
 (5) years of work experience.
 - b. Work experience may be combined with college training to obtain credit for a Bachelor's degree with one year of college credit equal to two years of work experience.
 - c. Years of work experience not applied to obtain credit for a Bachelor's degree will be granted Experience Level credit on the Base Salary Schedule at the rate of one year of teaching experience for each two years (1:2) of full time business or industrial experience.
- 3. Military work experience will be granted credit on the salary schedule equal to the number of years (1:1) for full time military service up to four (4) years. Military work experience will not be accepted for both military service credit and business or industrial experience credit.

Example Scenarios: (include calculation table/worksheet?)

Mr. Jones taught for 3 years at another career center. He has 9 years of full-time industry experience related to the program he is teaching. He does not have a bachelor's degree, but does have an Associate's degree with two years college training. To calculate his Experience Level:

- Teaching experience 1:1 = 3
- 8 years work experience (1:2) = 4
 - o 2 year Associate's degree = 4 years work experience
 - 9 years work experiences + 4 years obtained from Associate's degree= 13 years work experience
 - o 13 years work experience 5 years (credit for Bachelor's Degree) = 8 years work experience
- Experience Level = 7

Mrs. Jones has never taught, but has a Bachelor's degree and 15 years of full-time industry experience related to the program he is teaching.

- 15 years work experience (1:2)=7.5
- Experience Level = 7
