## This Month's Highlights

The **Central Nine Adult Education Division's 2012 Spring/Summer Catalog is here!**



Check out our new Administrative Assistant and Computer Support Analyst Programs! Central Nine continues to be the leader in offering approved Career Certification Programs listed on the Department of Workforce Development INTraining website for Region Five.

Central Nine offers training for adults in Welding Technology, Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), and Certified Nurse Aide (CNA). Central Nine is also in the process of developing a Commercial Driver Training (CDL) Program.

The **Adult Continuing Education** Program has already enrolled over 54 students for the spring semester. These services have generated over \$31,000.00 in revenue since December 1<sup>st</sup>.

Since December 1, 2011, Central Nine's **Adult Basic Education** Program has provided over 77 new adult learners with services related to GED Testing, GED/ESL classes, and GED Practice Testing. The adult basic education program has served over 500 students to date with new students enrolling regularly.

Our **English as a Second Language (ESL) Program** has experienced significant enrollment growth with classes that now have 50+ students in attendance. In partnership with the Burmese American Community Institute, we are currently planning to open a third ESL class within the M.S.D. of Perry Township. The class will be held at the Burmese Community Center located across from the Southport Public Library.

Additionally, the Central Nine ESL classes held at two Perry Township Elementary Schools (Winchester Village and Burkhardt) will now provide tutoring for school aged students. This service is being provided by the M.S.D. of Perry Township for the children of ESL adult learners attending classes at these locations. The children of the adult learners will receive assistance with their homework while their parents are in class. The Adult Education Program is grateful for the continued support and assistance provided by the M.S.D. of Perry Township.
