## **This Month's Highlights**

**Ivy Tech Community College-Indianapolis** informed Central Nine on Friday, June 8, 2012 of their intentions to not renew their facility usage contract for the 2012-13 semester citing capacity and financial reasons. Annually, the facility usage with Ivy Tech generated \$17,400 which will be lost revenue for Adult Education.

The **Central Nine Adult Education Division** is pleased to report that we are currently considering a partnership with the Edinburgh Correctional Facility at Camp Atterbury. This partnership will provide GED preparation classes for the residents of the facility.

**Central Nine's Adult Basic Education Program** will hold their 2012 GED Graduation on Wednesday, June 20, 2012 at Greenwood High School. The ceremony will begin promptly at 7:00pm. Please join us as we celebrate the successes of our adult learners.

The **Adult Basic and Continuing Education** Program provided or will provide services for over 224 students since April. These services have generated over \$27,860 in revenue. Since July 1, 2011, over 1,811adult learners have been provided with services related to GED Testing, GED/ESL classes, GED Practice Testing, Proctoring Services, NCCT Testing, and Adult Continuing Education on-campus and online courses. **Central Nine's Adult Basic Education Program** has provided adult basic education services to over 784 adult learners during the 2011-12 school year. The adult education program is currently developing units-based system of instruction for all GED and ESL classes. This system will provide adult learners with a focused and individualized instructional plan that focuses on their academic and career needs. The new system of instruction is being developed by the Curriculum Director, Adult Education Coordinator, and a team of GED/ESL teachers. The new adult education curriculum will be implemented during the 2012-13 program year.

For the 2012-13 program year, Central Nine's Adult Basic Education Program will not only receive over \$353,000 for the ABE Comprehensive Grant but has also applied for \$58,977 in EL Civics grant funds. This is a \$37,170 increase in EL Civics grant funds over the 2011-12 program year allocation. The increase is due to Central Nine's overall performance and increased enrollment in our English as a Second Language classes. Central Nine was also awarded \$11,978 in Innovation Funds for the addition of an Adult Education Outreach Coordinator. This position will provide a bridge between the Central Nine Adult Education Program and the WorkOne (and community) services available for adult learners.

The Adult Education Division staff and adult learners are thanked for a tremendous year of success and achievement.
