Curriculum and Instruction

The Fall 2012 Semester is off to a great start! There are several school-wide initiatives that are underway that are designed to help ensure the success and academic achievement of our students. These initiatives include the school-wide Literacy Enrichment in CTE Program that is being developed by Mrs. Arnold, English teacher. The literacy enrichment program begins with all students taking the Scholastic Reading Inventory to assess their current Lexile level. Once mitted their curriculum maps for the first year of their career education program. More information about the progress of this initiative will be provided in the coming months.

Second, the **2012 Character Education Program** has begun with Responsibility/Orderliness I August and Enthusiasm in September. We look forward to another year of great success with this program. Also, the teachers will participate in professional development and individualized work sessions during the 2012-13 school year to further align their programs to IDOE's literacy standards in writing, Common Core Reading/Math standards, the national CTE standards.

Finally, the teachers will continue their **Curriculum Mapping** work with the assistance of an English and Math teacher to ensure that academic content standards are integrated in their CTE classroom. Additionally, the teachers will work with Central Nine's new Master Teacher, Tom Jacobs, to further develop their instructional skills and lesson plan development skills using the Rigor/Relevance Framework.

ASVAB Testing

The students at Central Nine participated in taking the ASVAB test on September 6, 2012. The ASVAB was conducted for Career exploration purposes only. This enabled our students to have the opportunity to learn more about their abilities and aptitudes. There were over 64 test administrators and proctors from four different states. There were several compliments from the administrators and proctors. They were quite impressed with the overall facility and how responsive our students were and their ability to follow instructions. One of the key components to taking the ASVAB is the score interpretation session, as it explains in depth what the score actually means. The ASVAB interpretation sessions will begin and will last approximately 45 minutes for each class.
