## Principal

## Student Competitions

The Precision Machine program competed in a high school precision machining contest. The event was held Saturday, January 12 at the Ivy Tech Main Campus. There were a total of 8 high schools and a total of 16 participants. Two of the sixteen participants were from Central Nine Career Center. The students who participated from Central Nine include: Cody Hart (Whiteland) and Wesley Butler (Franklin Central). Prizes were given to the first four places and Cody Hart placed fourth overall winning a \$100.00 gift certificate for machining tools. Cody also had the highest score on the written test.

## Faculty Meeting/In-Service

The first day back for the second semester was scheduled for staff only. A teachers' meeting and inservice was held on Monday, January 7. The teachers' meeting was scheduled from 8 a.m. to 9 a.m. in the LGI and began with a team building exercise. Items discussed during the meeting pertained to Discipline, Lesson Plans, Lockdowns, Evaluations and Artifacts, Attendance, College and Career Readiness and Curriculum and Instruction. The remainder of the day provided staff with professional development opportunities on Next Navigator and Verbal Judo. The Next Navigator training demonstrated a new tool for instructors to utilize in class. The Verbal Judo explained to staff how to de-escalate situations.

## Principals Meeting

All principals, guidance counselors and curriculum directors from each of the participating schools met on Wednesday, February 6.
