CLNA - Size, Scope, and Quality Rubric Meeting

On October 1, Instructors met to complete the Size, Scope and Quality Rubric required for the Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment. The rubric helps evaluate whether career and technical education programs meet state-defined standards for enrollment, breadth of program offerings, program rigor; it also guides funding decisions.

Professional Learning
