Staffing

This month, we will begin our search for a Smart Manufacturing Instructor for the 2026-2027 school year.

Professional Learning

This month, instructors engaged in a learning styles workshop to gain insight about themselves and how designing lessons with learning styles in mind can support student success. We will begin our first round of ghost walks in the coming weeks.

Enrollment

Registration is underway at all partner schools. Secondary applications are being sent to students in programs that have additional requirements (Early Childhood Education, Exercise Science, and Pre-Nursing).

Middle School Recruitment Activities
